Safety Over Convenience

Help us keep students and staff safe.
Parents are free to park along the roadside in designated areas. Please do not enter the staff parking lot for drop off or pick up. The orange pylons at the front of the school indicate bus drop off areas, please do not park by the pylons at any time.

Supervision

School Staff supervise before school beginning at 8:14 a.m. and after school until 3:35 p.m.

On Thursdays, early dismissal is 1:57 p.m. and supervision is available until 2:07 p.m.

Late Arrivals & Leaving Early Lates: If your child arrives to school late, they must check in at the office.

Leaving Early: If your child is ill or needs to leave school for an appointment, the office needs to be notified by a parent. We ask that all students leaving early are signed out by a parent.



School is Open!

Schools remain open, even under the most severe weather conditions. This provides a safe environment for students who choose to attend. Parents must decide whether or not to send their child during severe weather. Parents should inform school (attendance on SchoolZone or call the office) if they choose to have their child remain home.

Weather Conditions & Recess

Students will continue to have recess, even in cold, windy, or wet conditions. Students should dress appropriately. Students will have an inside recess if:

- temperatures drop to -23 degrees
 Celsius or below
- · it is raining heavily
- the air quality reaches 7 or higher
- a heat warning has been issued

Cell Phone Use

As of 2024-2025, the Government of Alberta requires that personal tech devices (mobile phones, smart watches, iPads etc) be kept out of sight. Students will also not be able to access social media platforms on any EPSB network or device.

Students will not be permitted to use them at all during the day (including recess and lunch).

Should a student choose to bring their device and it is observed, staff will refer students to the office. Staff are not responsible for lost or damaged tech they have been discouraged from bringing.



This will help:

- ensure personal mobile devices and social media do not disrupt learning
- reduce distractions and bullying
- · maximize learning time
- support student mental health
